Some ideas about behaviour

- There is no key or manual that works with all children.
- Some things will work with your child, some others won't.
- Some things will only work temporarily.
- Do not be scared of setting boundaries for your child.

What we do now, it will save us headaches when they

are older.





Be positive

- Be Positive
- Be Fun (smile you are the adult).
- Be Structured (children need routine).
- Be Consistent. If mum says no and dad says yes.
- Be Fair. Listen to them.
- Set Effective Limits
- BE CLEAR ABOUT WHAT YOU WANT FROM THEM



Behaviour is connected to emotions

- Not knowing what we want them to do: Tell them, model for them.
- Anger
- Fear
- Anxiety
- Changes
- Prince or Princess status at home.
- Lack of empathy



Ignoring behaviour or manners we don't want.

- 'When you calm down we will talk'.
- 'When you tidy up, we can talk.'
- Then immediately when they calm down, respond to them.
- Give them choices you can do this now or later but they will do it.
- Give them a chance to fix the situation.



Trapped!

- Give them choices you can do this now or later but they will do it.

PRAISE

- If we want a behaviour to be repeated, we need to praise it.
- Praise is..... well done, thank you, a hug....praise does not have to be a prize or a treat....save these for special occasions.

INSTEAD OF THIS:

"If you don't finish your lunch, we're not going to the park." TRY THIS:

"When you're finished eating lunch, then we can go to the park."

INSTEAD OF THIS:

"For the last time, come here right now!"

TRY THIS:

"Do you want to come by yourself, or should I help you?"

INSTEAD OF THIS:

"Don't slam the door!"

TRY THIS:

"Please, close the door gently. Would you like me to show you how?"

INSTEAD OF THIS:

"Stop throwing a fit or I'll put the toy in the trash!"

TRY THIS:

"I know you're very sad that you can't play with your toy right now. Would you like a big hug until you feel better?"

INSTEAD OF THIS:

"I told you, you can't have cheerios for breakfast because we don't have any. Do not ask again."

TRY THIS:

"I hear how much you want cheerios. I wish I had magical powers to make a giant box appear just for you."



SHOUTING? USE THE RIGHT TONE OF VOICE and SHOW THE RIGHT FACE

- No need for shouting.
- Strict voice, serious face. Speak slow and short sentences.
- Come down to their level. If you scare them they are not going to get your message, only that you are cross with them.
- Do not laugh. We know they are cute, but they can see it as a joke otherwise they will not understand the behaviour is not acceptable.



Don't make false threats....

- Whatever you say make sure you can follow it through.
- Do not use another parent/family member as a threat...you are undermining yourself
